Like film, the design industry is rife with speculative and unpaid work, particularly for those starting out. We caught up with this year's designer to talk us through their poster inspiration, industry experience, and advice for new designers.

What is your experience in graphic design? (TP) I am a self-taught graphic designer since

2020. I graduated from an architecture university, but found passion for graphic design and decided to learn it myself. I have been doing a few personal branding projects and illustrations in the past year to develop my skills. This is the very first design pitch that I have ever done.

What was your inspiration for the poster?

The poster design evolved around the concept of TOGETHER. [It] tells a story of a miniature greenhouse where new seeds are planted, nurtured, and raised into beautiful plants that the world admires. Each plant represents a young talent with passion creativity. The festival ethos are expressed through the sense of warmth, support, and love. Here at LWFF, we get to enjoy beautiful films made by young people. 2021 is also the year that witnesses joint efforts made by many countries to alleviate a global crisis. This is the period where supporting and moving forward together is crucial to form a sustainable society. A flower, LWFF's logo, cannot bloom without a loving and nourishing community.

What are some obstacles you've come up against breaking into graphic design?

The decision to leave the career I have been investing in for 6 years and pursue graphic design. I was pulled into two opposite directions, between the work I'm familiar with but not really interested in and the work that I'm passionate about, yet holds uncertainty. The fear of wasting time changing to another career contributed to my hesitation. Little did I know that by being hesitant, I had already wasted so much time. It took courage and determination to finally make the decision and I'm glad that I did!

What's a helpful piece of advice you've heard?

Pablo Picasso "It took me four years to paint like Raphael, but a lifetime to paint like a child". The quote really struck me, making me realize the importance of being open-minded about life. Too often I let my actions and creativity be restricted by social prejudice and regulations. [For children] the world is limitless and full of curiosity. They take action without the fear of failing. [Since hearing that], I have started experimenting more and pushing myself out of my comfort zone, really exploring the world with a curious mind and open eyes.
